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


One of the greatest highlights of my writing journey is that my book became an Amazon bestseller within its first year and it will be coming out in the bookstores soon.

Kartavya, Karm Aur Main is an enticing and enlightening non-fictional read that revolves around the idea of the karmnishtha that author Dr. Karwa wants to highlights about. The book is divided into 15 chapters of moderate length and has a few extra chapters on various topics like past, present, mirror, routine work, society and so on. The first thing that strikes the reader is the lucid writing style of the author. He expresses in a simplified and sophisticated manner, the concepts that he is trying to put forth and the subtle arguments that he is making. This makes for an easy read and it creates an atmosphere where the reader is put at ease in terms of being able to connect with the topic at hand. There is a rich vocabulary used to enhance the conceptual clarity of the reader but it still is not difficult to digest or understand the points that are made. The second thing that strikes the reader is the methodological clarity that adds to the quality of the prose and uplifts the reading experience to a notch higher than other contemporary non-fictional works. This is caused by the systematic manner of relaying the points, providing analogies, explicitly dealing with simplified examples and not engaging in any form of exaggeration. The idea is to take the lessons from the Hindu scriptures like the Bhagwat Gita, Samudra Purana, Dhyana Yoga, Karma Yoga and so on. Lessons from these scriptures have been explained in simple language for the youth to follow. So, the target audience is the youth of today's India and abroad who are looking for spiritual answers and want to reconnect with their roots. The analogies drawn are extremely relevant to today's society and it is relayed in such a simplified manner that the youth of today can relate to it easily. The focus is on understanding life, its purpose, its struggles and the meaning behind those struggles. These are not philosophised or emphasised through random anecdotes but ones that the youth are used to hearing from an early age and may have come across several times in their lives. This does not mean that the book is boring or reiterates the same points over and over again. Rather, its presentation of the ideas and didactic points is such that these seem to be shedding a new light onto the old adages and also in a new form of expression. The pace of the narrative is moderate which makes it easy to follow and creates a sync between the manner of relaying the points and the grasping capacity of the reader. Its focus is to enhance the understanding of the scriptures and to reduce the distance and apprehension that the average young reader feels towards these books. The characters are all taken from these aforementioned scriptures and some incidents from their lives are mentioned to show how these incidents shaped their life and how their response to these incidents also brought about a lot of changes.

This brings out the strength and depth of their characters in which are lessons for all to learn. Some important concepts include karma, daya and daan that the author brings forth in the form of examples, adages and analogies. Explanation is provided in paragraphs that are of moderate though unequal length but they cater to the need of the reader and brings things down to a very basic level so that no one has an issue to understand the concepts and so that there is no dispute between what is conveyed by the author and what is considered by the reader. The bright book cover is attractive and this practice of keeping up pictorial representations is maintained discreetly throughout the book. The illustrations are original and have a lot of clarity though they are black and white unlike the cover that is highly colourful. The book is highly heart touching, deeply moving and very thoughtful. It provides a new take on age old knowledge that is very much at our disposal but is hardly looked upon and consulted as there is the underlying apprehension that it may be too didactic or moralistic to fit with the modern society. This is the myth that this Kartavya, Karma Aur Main busts. It rests on these three aspects that remain the responsibility of the individual to put in their effort and focus on self reliance and self growth. In this sense the book provides a solution and creates a space of understanding between the reader and the ideas that are mentioned in the book. It makes these ideas araspable, easy to understand and easily applicable. On the whole, the book is a fruitful and engaging read and definitely one that calls for an attentive reading in order to make the most of the ideas conveyed.



On that night, the wolves were silent, but moon was howling in the sky.





EDITOR'S CHOICE

GANDHI WINS SOUTH AFRICA

Dr. Mazhar Kibriya in Gandhi Wins South Africa has succeeded to relate the complexity of theory and practice of Mahatma Gandhi into a simple and highly readable book. What emerges is not a life that was written in the stars but the growth and development of an ordinary man who in confronting the dehumanization of colonialism and apartheid in India and South Africa became extraordinary himself.

Trying to remember how a famous man was before he became famous can be an irritating exercise. This is so because their image as paragons of human perfection precedes them. To see them apart from that acquired image

seem almost sacrilegious. For one thing it is seen as reflecting badly on the contemporaries of the great man. You want to kick yourself for having been unable to observe the qualities that subsequently became obvious to the whole world. We read in Luke 4:24 of the New Testament that "No Prophet is acceptable in his own country". So it was with Gandhi.

Gandhi's transmogrification was not a Damascus moment. Dr. Mazhar Kibriya helps to walk us through this extraordinary but immensely human journey. We are able to see this London trained but tongue-tied barrister who could not utter a single sentence to defend his client in his first court case in the then Bombay. Of course, with hindsight we can say he was in good company. God sent Moses to reveal His purpose in spite of his being inarticulate.

As Dr. Mazhar Kibriya puts it "He had no skill to conduct a case as he was not well conversant with Indian Law, Indian History and above all Human Nature. After this incident he left legal practice until he went to South Africa".

Gandhi arrived in Durban in May 1893. A few weeks after his arrival he boarded a train to Johannesburg at the service of Dada Abdullah and Company to settle a law suit in Pretoria. He had a first class ticket provided by the Company and befitting of his middle class status and a professional barrister-at-law. On reaching Pietermaritzburg he was told by a railway official to move to a Third-Class compartment after an objection by a fellow white passenger. When he objected, he was pushed out of the train.

It was one of the coldest winter nights, "He had encountered the dreaded disease of colour prejudice. He had to make a choice – abandon his task in South Africa and go back to India or embark on a struggle against colour discrimination".

"My active Non-Violence began from that date" (Dr. Mazhar Kibriya, p. (10).

Gandhi held a strong belief that "if we take care of the facts of a case, the law will take care of itself" (ibid., p. 14). He, therefore, imposed on himself the lifelong habit of studying the facts of each situation and speak and act on the basis of a complete mastery of the facts. This belief strengthened his faith in persuasion, appeal, arbitration and a reciprocal compromise on the grounds of facts and truth..." (ibid, p.15).

Some six years after Gandhi's sojourn in South Africa, the Anglo-Boer war broke out between 1899 and 1902. Three personalities who were to become world statesmen of the 20th century participated in different capacities in this war.

These were: General Smuts as a war general, Winston Churchill as a journalist and Prisoner of War, and Mahatma Gandhi as a Stretch Bearer and Humanitarian.

In an ironic twist of fate, the Gandhi statue in London stands alongside that of Winston Churchill who once referred to Gandhi as a halfnaked fakir and that of General Jan Smuts who imprisoned Gandhi several times in South Africa. It was while in prison in South Africa that Gandhi learnt to make sandals. He presented a pair of these sandals to General Smuts the then South African Prime Minister. Smuts wore these sandals at his farm in Irene, eastern Transvaal. As Gandhi acquired fame later, General Smuts returned the sandals saying he was not worthy to wear the sandals crafted by the hands of a great man like Gandhi.

As a stretch bearer who also tended to the wounded as a volunteer, Gandhi was awarded the Kaiser-i-Hind gold medal in 1915. However, on the 4th of August 1920, Gandhi returned the Kaiser-i-Hind gold medal granted to him for his humanitarian work in South Africa, the Zulu war medal granted for services in charge of Indian Volunteer Ambulance Corps in 1906 and as Assistant Superintendent of the Indian Volunteer Stretcher-bearer corps between 1899 and 1900. But why participate in the war at all?

Firstly, the best chance for freedom from discrimination for Indians in South Africa was seen to be located within what was referred to as British sense of fair play. The service of Indians in the war was a practical sign of their loyalty in the British Empire. "But just after the end of the war their services were forgotten altogether. Britain was tending Boer wounds and did not intend to wound Boer susceptibilities by redressing Indian grievances". (Dr. Mazhar Kibriya, p.45).

Choices were being made which would shape the political development of South Africa and India for the next century and beyond. About three thousand (3000) Indian people led by Gandhi gathered at a mass meeting at the Empire Theatre in Johannesburg to protest against the Asiatic Law Amendment Ordinance that was to be introduced in the Transvaal Legislative Council which was effectively forcing Pass Laws on Indians. This meeting took place on the 11 September 1906. A solemn oath was individually taken by all those in attendance not to submit to this tyrannical law even at the cost of imprisonment or even death. At first, Gandhi referred to this movement as the Passive Resistance, "one kind of mass-yet individual opposition to government unfairness" with a solemn vow in the name of God.

Gandhi, however, had misgivings about a God based struggle to be articulated only in English. He, therefore, called for proposals for a more fitting name from the people for this Resistance Movement. Maganlal Gandhi, a second cousin to Gandhi proposed a name "Sadagraha" which was amended by Gandhi to "Satyagraha".

"The word Satyagraha was coined with the help of two Gujrati words –

Satya and Agraha. According to Gandhi Satya meaning Truth implies love

and Agraha meaning Firmness implies force. Thus, Satyagraha implies Force which is born of Truth, and Love or Non-Violence. Thus, Satyagraha means "Firmness in Truth or Firmness in Love". In other words, it may be said as Truth-Force or Love-Force or Soul-Force. A person practicing this method was to be called Satyagrahi. In this way, the term Satyagraha came into existence and the Indian movement of non-compliance began to be known as the Satyagraha Movement or simply Satyagraha.


Gandhi left South Africa for India in 1915. Already his reputation had preceded him. He was to lead the freedom movement perfecting Satyagraha as a preeminent method of struggle until India attained its freedom in 1947. Gandhi is deservedly known as the Father of Freedom of India.

Satyagraha was mutatis mutandis implemented in the Civil Rights struggle in the USA and in the anticolonial struggle in Asia, Africa and the Caribbean.

Dr. Mazhar Kibriya in Gandhi Wins South Africa has presented all those fighting against all forms of oppression with a highly readable source material.

GANDHI WINS INDIA

In today's world, politics and violence have become partners. Hate campaigns, rampaging mobs, arbitrary arrests, tortures, rapes, killings, burning, looting, rioting, bombs and bullets are everyday news. There is exploitation, suppression and extermination of whole sections of population. Age old humanitarian values seem to have been forgotten. Sacred and lofty principles of human fraternity and equality are being violated at all levels in the society. The principle of 'Might is Right' is the order of the day. Humanism and altruism will disappear altogether from the earth. Only the man with wolfish qualities will survive while the man with humanitarian qualities will be doomed to death or will be condemned to suffer a life of permanent pain.

The present book, Gandhi Wins India, is a serious attempt to find out a remedy to correct this hopeless situation without using violence of any kind. And this remedy has been found in the Theory and Practice of Non-Violence and Non-Violent Method of Satyagraha of Gandhi who propounded, practised, preached, and propagated his Non-Violent Method of Satyagraha to fight against exploitations, repressions, oppressions, and suppressions pursued by the British Government in India. In South Africa as well as in India, Gandhi very successfully adopted and applied his Non-violent Methods of Satyagraha like Non-Violent Non-Cooperation and Civil Disobedience to fight against the racial discriminations, to established democratic rights and ultimately to win the Complete Independence of India from the domination of the British Rule.

In the present book, Gandhi Wins India, a thorough analysis of the application of Gandhi's Non-Violent Methods of Non-Cooperation and Civil Disobedience otherwise named by Gandhi as SATYAGRAHA has been made. As Gandhi was having an unflinching faith in the Truth and Non-Violence, he went zealously on developing the Principles of Non-Violence into a powerful but peaceful Method of Change known as the Satyagraha. Through extensive reading of the teachings of various reliaions of the world and of various thinkers, reformers, and social workers of both oriental and occidental origin and through their constant applications in practical politics, Gandhi enriched, transformed, and theorised the Principles of Non-Violence into a peaceful Method of Change giving it an Indian name Satyagraha. Before Gandhi, no one had tried to use the virtue of Non-Violence as a tool and technique of social and political change so purely, convincingly, effectively, coherently, vividly, and bravely as Gandhi did in South Africa as well as in India. Before Gandhi's bold and courageous experiment with the Method of Non-violence as a tool of peaceful sociopolitico-economic change, the virtue of Non-Violence was considered merely as a virtue to be adopted and practised to correct and cure personal ills and to avoid the wrath of God. But Gandhi gave an entire different practical dimension to the virtue of Non-Violence for solving complex and puzzling problems concerning the Individuals, Society and the State.

According to Gandhi, the Philosophy of Satyagraha is aimed to win over and convert the wrongdoer into a righteous person through a full and complete observance of the virtues of Non-Violence, Truth, Love, Self- suffering. Self-sacrifice, Endurance, Tolerance, and a high degree of respect for the feelings and sentiment of the opponent. The Philosophy of Satyagraha insists on not harming and not injuring the opponent's body and property, but the Satyagraha demands peaceful and active opposition to immorality, injustice and exploitation by Non-Violent-force, Truth-force, Moral-force, Love-force, Soul-force, Self-suffering, Self-sacrifice and Self-injury. The Philosophy of Satyagraha repudiates suspicion, ill-will and spying against the opponent which are a continuous source of hatred and enmity giving rise to violence. The aim of Satyagraha is twofold-eradication of exploitations and injustices and conversion of the wrong-doer to good by appealing his head and heart through the pursuit of moral and ethical elements as mentioned above. The Satyagrahi (as the follower of Satyagraha is called) should bear all injuries and hardships in doing so. Gandhi propounds that both the Satyagrahi and the evil-doer have a soul or a conscience which responds to the heat of Non-Violence, Truth, Love, Spirit and Morality and, therefore, both should be amended accordingly. The degree of such response and amendment of the soul or conscience is directly proportional to the temperature of the heat of Non-Violence, Truth, Love, Morality, Self-suffering, Self-sacrifice and Self-injury. Thus, the Principle of Satyagraha is a Non-Violent-force, a Truth-force, a Love-force, a Moral-force, and a Soul-force pitched against Brute-force, Armed force and even Nuclear-force.

In fact, it was Gandhi's greatest achievement which he attained during his 22 years anti-apartheid struggle in South Africa and his about 32 years Non-Violent Struggle for the achievement of Independence of India in the Indian National Movement. Gandhi showed the unarmed and the downtrodden and the poverty-stricken people of India as well as the world how to face the challenges of violence without resorting to violence? He taught the people how to save both the exploiter and the exploited from being drenched in their own blood and, thereby, to save humanities and other godly qualities of human beings so that both the weak and the strong would live in peace and tranquility. In a nut shell, Gandhi moralized practical politics by basing it on the virtues of Non-Violence, Truth, Love and other moral and ethical elements and emphasized the need to use politics for the welfare and betterment of the entire community of human beings without any discrimination. Basically, Gandhi adopted and glorified the lofty principles of humanitarianism and altruism in every field of life, even in practical politics. Because for Gandhi, Non-Violence, Truth, God, Love, Morality, Religion and Politics are all convertible terms and hence, they should be used for the benefit, betterment, and salvation of Mankind.

Thus, the present book, Gandhi Wins India deeply elaborates Gandhi's Theory of Non-Violence and the Philosophy of Satyagraha and analyses carefully and rationally the historical applications of Gandhi's Principles of Non-Violent Methods of Non-Cooperation and Civil Disobedience otherwise known as the Satyagraha and its final outcome in the Indian National Movement in the form of Complete Independence of India from the British Rule on 15 August, 1947.

The Shadow is an enticing detective fiction with a plot full of twists and turns that will keep readers on the edge and asking for more. The book is well organised and has a good control on the direction and manner in which the plot flows. The plot revolves around a character named Sheldon Marlow who is a detective. He has an assistant named Sam who are visiting a particular destination to spend some time during their holidays. Marlow is given the title of Hardcore Detective. He encounters the case in which two people try to murder a girl which makes Marlow discover something that is out of the ordinary and something that he least expected. This forms the turning point and the major climax of the plot.

It makes the detective Marlow to reopen the case that had been closed by the police long back in the past due to the lack of sufficient clues. This is the gist of the plot of the book. It is about the way in which detective Marlow unravels the mystery by digging deep into a series of mind -boggling events. Another climax of the plot remains the case when the person who wants to kill the girl gets killed by the same murderer who wants to kill the girl. This takes Marlow into the past that is almost 15 years left behind as he begins to see patterns in a maze of mysterious incidents and events. The thrill of the plot lies in the suspense as to whether the detective will be able to completely solve this mystery or not. The ending remains equally engrossing and eye popping as most of the plot.

As previously mentioned, the book is well organised and has a list of characters mentioned in the very beginning of the book. It comprises of 8 chapters and a prologue. The contents page provides the estimate about the number of chapters and at a length of over 230 pages, the book is a lengthy read though clearly very captivating. The chapters are on the lengthier side and each chapter has a well- structured beginning, middle and end. The writing style is one that adds to the energy of the plot. It is easy to understand and has an apt use of vocabulary. It is lucid, simple and non-flowery language that makes the plot easy to understand for the reader despite its several ups and downs.

However, the book is full of information and has a lot of input that requires the reader to be attentive throughout the course of the reading process. Yet, it is also this aspect that makes the book very interesting. It makes the reader get involved in the plot of the text that requires the reader to make notes, jot down points and create lists to try to solve the issues of the plot along with detective Marlow if not before him. It makes the book almost like a work book or activity book that can be worked out and this is an aspect of detective novels that has been kept alive by Joseph. Despite all this, the book is full of characters and has an ample number of characters strewn across the plot of the text that makes increases the difficulty level of the reader and makes it hard for him to follow through if he is not attentive though that should not be the case with active readers who are not passively following through but actively engaged in the course of events that pans out. It is the character of Marlow that is of prime importance and he has been given centre stage though that does



not mean that the foil character of Sam is not of importance. Sam serves as a foil character who helps Marlow and provides his intelligent and quirky input and adds dimension to both the plot and the character of Marlow. Similarly, the other minor characters also increase the importance of Marlow and his role as the chief detective. They showcase aspects of the plots and different aspects that make the readers see the depth of knowledge and confidence that Marlow has in playing out this crucial role. The title of the book remains the most significant aspect of the book as it provides a multi-dimensional view to Marlow who is the shadow and epitome of unveiling mysteries while his shadow remains his assistant Sam who is indispensable to solving the mysteries of the plot. Similarly, the double murder mystery in the plot is indicated by the title that suggests that the main murderer is hiding in the shadow of the second murderer who may also be the same person. So, in daylight he is a person whose shadow commits heinous crimes at night. Overall, the book is an entertaining read and one that needs to be devoured and clearly painstakingly deciphered.




